

The Special meeting of the McGill Town Council was held on June 11, 2014 at the McGill Senior/Community Center located at the top of Avenue K at 5:30 P.M.

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Council Chairman Winder called the meeting to order at 5:32 P.M.

Council Chairman Winder called upon Council Member Dubrutz to lead the Council and Audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Council Chairman Winder called for comments from the public.

Jesse Ciscar addressed the Council referring to the correspondence received from the Council Secretary stating that he had not been one of the candidates selected for an interview. He is here this evening to request an interview.

Council Chairman Winder noted that 2 of the applicants selected for interviews did not appear; therefore, they are disqualified. And, yes, Jesse Ciscar may be interviewed.

Two applicants were interviewed the following order:

1. Dee Fullmer
2. Jesse Ciscar

Each applicant left the room while the other was interviewed. Questions were asked of both applicants, as follows:

Why do you want the job? Do have any driving violations? Can you work weekends? Can you operate yard equipment? Can you repair sprinklers? Do you plan on remaining on the job through the summer? Do you have experience hauling a trailer? Are you motivated to work

without supervision? How are you at following instructions? Will you be able to return each summer?

Council Member Dubrutz noted that one of the applicants listed that he had a DUI. He investigated this, and found that those charged had been dismissed and he was only cited for reckless driving. Therefore, both applicants have suitable driving records.

The Council deliberated making note of the applicant's responses.

Council Chairman Winder explained that both applicants are capable of doing the work. There was a unique situation this year when the previous part time assistant left his position early in the season, leaving the Parks Manager falling behind in his work. The McGill Fiscal Year does not end until the June 30<sup>th</sup>, and there are sufficient funds remaining in that line item to support 2 assistant grounds keepers. It is hoped that whoever is selected will return next year.

Council Member Borovansky motioned to hire Jesse Ciscar for the position of seasonal grounds keeper, and hire Dee Fullmer to work as long as funds are available and as long as it takes to bring the parks back to their best condition.

Council Member Dubrutz seconded the motion.

Motion was carried by a unanimous vote of the quorum present.

The Council directed the secretary to prepare the necessary correspondence and notifications.

Council Chairman Winder noted that somebody in the community has spread rumors that the Town Council had already hired someone. Other rumors have been spread that the Town Council spends too much money maintaining their parks. These rumors are false. Also, the newspaper made a mistake in the advertisement by listing the wrong date to submit applications. This was followed up with calls to the Employment Office and the White Pine County Human Resource Director. The deadline date listed with the Employment Office is the date that is to be followed.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT:

Council Chairman Winder called for further comments.

Council Member Borovansky noted that the Town Council was able to select capable park workers.

Parks Manager Robinson noted that he really did need someone who would come back to work each year.

#### MEETING ADJOURNED:

There being no further business or comments to be brought before the McGill Town Council, the meeting adjourned at 6:07 P.M.
